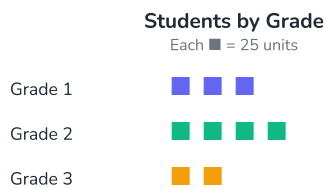

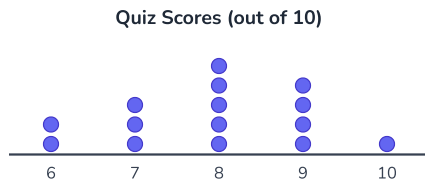

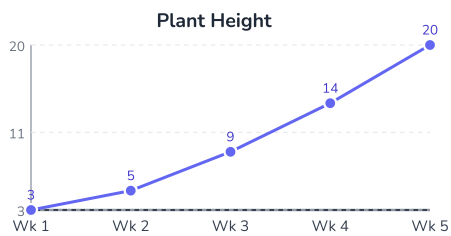

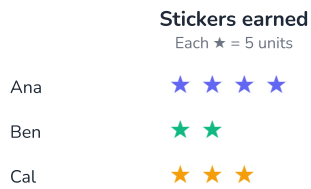

Answer Key

Graphs & Data — Hard

1. 225 students

Grade 1: $3 \times 25 = 75$. Grade 2: $4 \times 25 = 100$. Grade 3: $2 \times 25 = 50$. Total: $75 + 100 + 50 = 225$.

2. 10 students

Above 7 means 8, 9, or 10: $5 + 4 + 1 = 10$ students.

3. Between Week 4 and Week 5 (grew 6 cm)

Growth per week: 2, 4, 5, 6. The biggest jump is from Week 4 (14 cm) to Week 5 (20 cm): 6 cm.

4. 45 stickers

Ana: $4 \times 5 = 20$. Ben: $2 \times 5 = 10$. Cal: $3 \times 5 = 15$. Total: $20 + 10 + 15 = 45$.

5. 9

Add: $3 + 4 + 2 = 9$ students.

6. 9

Add: $2 + 4 + 3 = 9$.

7. 2

Subtract: $6 - 4 = 2$ more.

8. 10

Add: $5 + 3 + 2 = 10$ students.

9. 4

Subtract: $7 - 3 = 4$ more apples.

10. art

Compare: $8 > 5 > 2$, so art is the most popular.
