Answer Key

Money & Coins — Easy

1. 25 cents

A quarter is worth 25 cents.

2. 10 cents

A dime is worth 10 cents.

3. 10 cents

Each nickel = 5 cents. $2 \times 5 = 10$ cents.

4. 30 cents

Each dime = 10 cents. $3 \times 10 = 30$ cents.

5. 35 cents

Quarter = 25¢, Dime = 10¢. Total: $25 + 10 = 35$ ¢.

6. 23 cents

2 dimes = 20¢, 3 pennies = 3¢. Total: $20 + 3 = 23$ ¢.

7. 3 nickels (15¢) are worth 5 cents more than 1 dime (10¢).

3 nickels = $3 \times 5 = 15$ ¢. 1 dime = 10¢. Difference: $15 - 10 = 5$ ¢ more.

8. 3 cents

$10\text{¢} - 7\text{¢} = 3\text{¢}$ change.

9. 36 cents

$25 + 5 + 5 + 1 = 36$ ¢.

10. 5 nickels

1 quarter = 25¢. Each nickel = 5¢. $25 \div 5 = 5$ nickels.
